Therefore, upon review and consideration, and GOOD CAUSE APPEARING,

IT IS ORDERED that Appellant's Final Motion to Extend Time to File Opening Brief is granted.

175. 24-May-2023 On May 19, 2023, Appellant Edward McCauley, filed two Motions for Procedural Order with the Court: (1) an Unopposed Motion to Exceed Word Limit for the Reply Brief; and (2) an Unopposed Final Motion to Extend Time to File Reply Brief. Both motions indicate that Appellant's counsel has contacted counsel for the State who does not object to either motion. The State has not filed a response to either motion.
- Appellant's request to exceed the word limit in Ariz. R. Crim. P. 31.14(a) argues that extraordinary circumstances necessitate exceeding the word limit outlined in Rule 31.14(a). Appellant contends that "[t]he issues presented in [Appellant's] Opening Brief were lengthy and fact intensive," the State's Answering Brief used 37,494 words of the 37,500 words allowed by the Court's May 20, 2022, order, and "responding to the Answering Brief's challenges to the appropriate standards of review and contested factual issues requires considerable briefing." Motion at 2. Counsel further avers that "[t]he issues presented in this matter are significant, and ethically require counsel to file a Reply Brief in excess of [] 14,000 words." Id. (citing Ariz. R. Crim. P. 6.8(a)(5); American Bar Association Guidelines for the Appointment and Performance of Counsel in Death Penalty Cases, Guideline 10.15.1.C and commentary (2003)).
- Appellant's request to extend the time to file a reply brief seeks a twenty-one day extension from the current due date of May 26, 2023, to on or before June 16, 2023. Counsel for Appellant aver they have "completed a draft reply[] [b]ut the current draft is just under 19,000 words," and "responding to the [] challenges to the appropriate standards of review and contested factual issues requires considerable briefing." Therefore, counsel states that "[a]dditional time is needed to finish editing the Reply Brief and reduce the length to a word limit authorized by this Court." Motion at 3. Finally, counsel states that "[a]bsent unforeseen circumstances, this is the final request to extend time to file the Reply Brief." Id.
- The Court's original order for briefing was issued June 9, 2020, and set September 8, 2020, as the due date for the opening brief. Appellant's opening brief, after what was essentially seven extensions of the due date, was filed on May 25, 2022. Appellee's answering brief, after receiving four extensions of the due date, was filed on February 24, 2023.
- The Court understands that multiple extensions of the due dates to file the opening brief and answering brief were requested and granted by this Court. Nevertheless, considering the multiple extensions already received by both parties to file their briefs and the resultant amount of time that has passed since the Court's initial briefing order in this case, the Court notes, in the strongest possible terms, this case must proceed.
- Therefore, the Court takes Appellant's counsel at their word and no further extensions of time to file the reply brief will be granted absent unforeseen and extraordinary circumstances.
- Based upon review and consideration of the foregoing, and good cause appearing,
- IT IS ORDERED that Appellant's Motion to Exceed Word Limit for the Reply Brief, based on the specific circumstances in this matter, is granted in part. Appellant shall file a reply brief that shall not exceed 17,000 words.
- IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that Appellant's Motion to Extend the Time to File Reply Brief, based on the specific circumstances in this matter, is granted.
- IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that Appellant's reply brief, upon consideration of Appellant's motion and the requirements pursuant to Rule 31.14(c)(1), shall be filed no later than June 16, 2023.
- IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that A.R.S. § 13-4042 and Rule 31.14(c)(2) be complied with to the extent required by law. (Hon. John R. Lopez IV)
