6. 5-Mar-2024 On March 4, 2024, Petitioner Denatale filed his third motion for procedural order in this case prior to filing the petition for review. The current motion is titled Motion for Procedural Order (Stay Request of Deadline to File Petition for Review) and requests that the Court stay the deadline to file the petition for review pending the United States Supreme Court's decision on a petition for certiorari filed by Real Party in Interest Lonnie Bassett in CR-22- 0227-PR.
- Petitioner has filed two prior motions for procedural orders on December 28, 2023, and January 29, 2024, respectively, both titled Motion for Procedural Order (Motion for Extension of Time). Each prior motion stated that the extension was needed because counsel required additional time to conduct legal research and complete drafting of the petition for review.
- While the Court does have wide latitude to modify deadlines under Ariz. R. Crim. P. 31.3(e), it is not the Court's practice to grant a stay of indeterminate length, pending the resolution of a petition for writ of certiorari in a different case, lacking a petition for review that frames the issues presented for the Court's review.
- Therefore,
- IT IS ORDERED that Petitioner's Motion for Procedural Order (Stay Request of Deadline to File Petition for Review) is denied.
- IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the petition for review is due on or before March 20, 2024. No further extensions of time shall be granted absent extraordinary circumstances.
- This matter is subject to dismissal if the petition for review is not filed by March 20, 2024. (Hon. James P. Beene)
