- 13-May-2026 Petitioner Gibson, pro se, filed an "Application for Issuance of Writ Under Original Jurisdiction." Petitioner seeks an order disqualifying or recusing the superior court judge; an order to "vacatur/set aside (reversal) of the Order for Provisional Remedy Without Notice Replevin and any dependent enforcement orders entered"; and an order reassigning the case to a different judicial officer. Petitioner also seeks expedited consideration.  
Pursuant to Rule 11(b) of the Rules of Procedure for Special Actions ("RPSA"), "Appellate special actions are those requesting review of an earlier decision of a lower court." However, "If a special action is filed in the Court of Appeals or Supreme Court and the action might have been properly initiated in a lower court, the petition must state the reasons for not filing it in the lower court. If the appellate court finds these reasons insufficient, it will dismiss the petition without prejudice." RPSA 11(c). Accordingly,  
  
IT IS ORDERED dismissing this proceeding without prejudice to Petitioner filing a request for change of judge as provided in Arizona Rules of Civil Procedure 42.1 or 42.2, if warranted, or filing a proper appeal or special action proceeding in the Court of Appeals in accordance with the Rules of Procedure for Special Actions or the Rules of Civil Appellate Procedure.
