Under Arizona Rules of Civil Appellate Procedure, Rule 6(b), a motion for a procedural order must include a statement by the moving party of whether the other parties consent to, or object to, the entry of the order that is sought; or why the moving party was unable to contact the other parties before filing the motion. Further, the caption of a motion for procedural order must include the words, "Motion for Procedural Order." The July 6, 2026 motion is Appellant's third consecutive motion that is non-compliant in these respects following the Court of Appeals' June 5, 2026 Memorandum Decision.
